<u>Alien (Scott, 1979)</u> <u>Apocalypse Now (Coppola, 1979)</u> <u>The Red Turtle (Dudok, 2016)</u>

Answer the following question:

How does the director of each clip use film form to communicate meaning?

Use this guide to **film form** to write your response.

- 2. Research activity: Who was Arthur Penn? Create a profile on Penn including:
 - his style as a filmmaker a timeline of his films
 - his views and ideas common themes in his work
- 3. Create a **presentation** on a scene that affects you strongly. Access the guide to this task <u>here</u>.
- 4. Watch the following films:
 Bonnie and Clyde (Penn, 1967, US) Casablanca (Curtiz, 1942, US)
 -Pans Labrynith (Guillermo del Toro, 2006, Spain)- City of God (Mereilles and Lund 2002, Brazil)
